Monday morning was busy with large group activities and skill sessions. Following lunch on Monday all participants were requested to complete evaluations for camp planners to use in preparation for Safety Camp 2008. Cabin clean-up and garbage check were the final activities of the weekend.

Although the weather was not co-operative (snow and rain) the camp was well-attended and it gave the camp planners a chance to test their ability to alter schedules and re-assign skill sessions on short notice. The designated facilitators were also able to re-act and provide appropriate sessions based on altered weather patterns. (sports/crafts)
